1. Request #19-013 – Request for Traffic Calming Measures on E. 27th St (Justine Giacalone)

(Citizen states constant speeding, a need for traffic calming measures for the safety of the pedestrian traffic traveling to the schools in the vicinity.

Citizen stated only 1 sign on Midge Avenue entering school zones, none on Green Street. Citizen mentioned on Buena Vista Drive there are poles with flashing lights. Chairperson Michael Beltran stated warrants need to be met for calming measures to be put in place. Committee Member Dan Dabney stated entering school zone is needed on both ends. Committee Member Juan Olmos stated he will check for school zone sign on Green Street near school zone off Green Street before Midge Avenue. Upon review of area, a school sign on E 27th Street was in place just not visible.

2. Request #19-014 – Request for Removal of Red Curb on W. 18th St. & O St. (Julie Nelson)

(Citizen requests the removal of a red curb from the north east corner of W. 18th St. & O St., as it is not listed in the City of Merced Municipal Code.)

Chairperson Michael Beltran stated this specific red curb is not in the Merced Municipal Code, but if the red curb was removed it would then validate a new parking space. Chairperson Michael Beltran stated all other

red curbs on intersection should match. Committee Member Dan Dabney stated there needs to be 20 ft from curb ramp intersection per California Vehicle Code. Chairperson Michael Beltran stated they would need to revisit red zones for Merced Municipal Code verification. Committee Member Juan Olmos stated California Manual for Uniform Traffic Control Devices requires 20 ft from curb ramp as well.

Committee Member Michael Hren stated speed humps are not effective and cause issues for emergency vehicles. Residential speaker stated people fly by fast and that studies do not state speed humps are ineffective. Committee Member Michael Hren stated speed bumps direct traffic to other streets. Chairperson Michael Beltran stated road crowns too much for speed table. Committee Member Juan Olmos stated did a study was completed 3 years ago, crews fixed reflectors and striping was added on Lehigh Drive. Residential speaker stated that it was never revisited since their previous application, but was supposed to be. Committee Member Juan Olmos asked to check if there are warrants for San Jose Avenue at Lehigh Drive and at University Drive. Committee Member Dan Dabney stated there have been no major crashes.

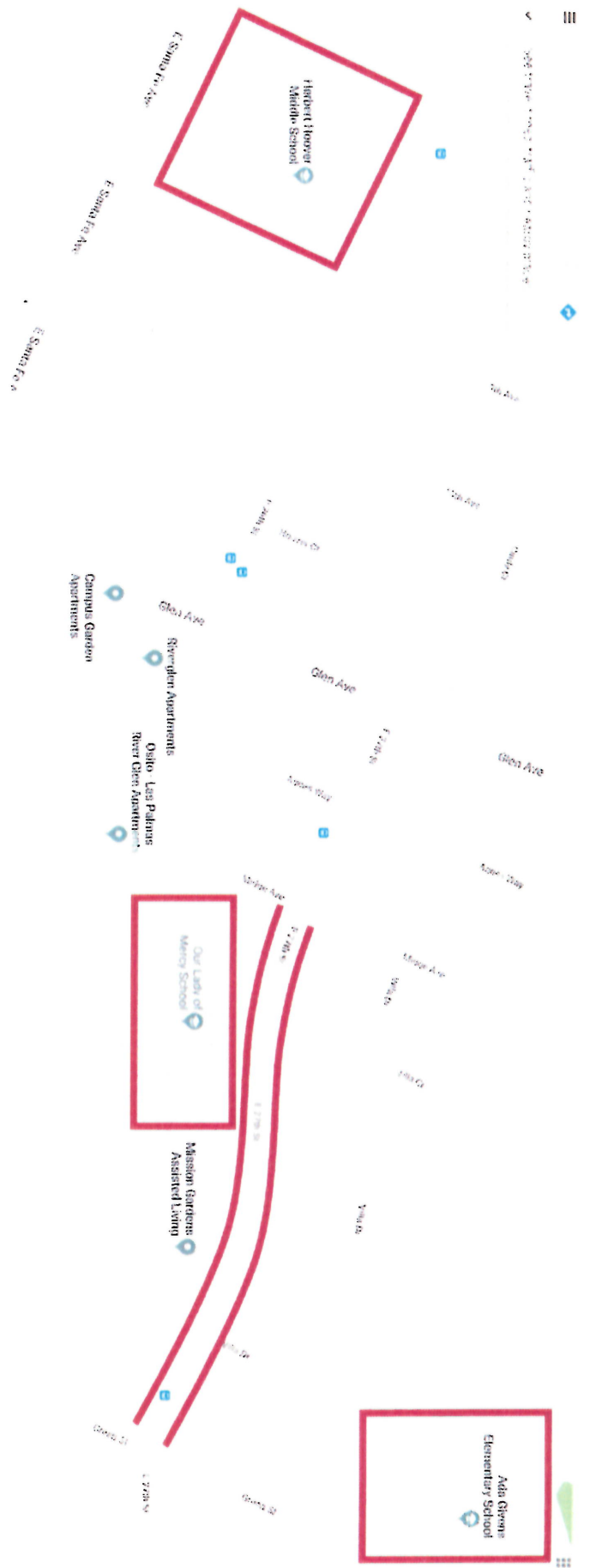
General Diagram

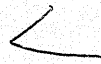
General Diagram

Possibly under a permit from the City of Merced, or without a permit, due to the fact it was only "flat work," my now-deceased husband, [REDACTED], and I installed a 10' wide, near 60' long concrete parking/drive pad along the southern edge of our [REDACTED] Villa Drive Merced property, from the city sidewalk, along the south side of our home, to our back yard. We used the pad to park various motor homes and boats we owned through the years.

Concurrently, we stayed distant from, but always got along with, our neighbors, the [REDACTED], a couple in their early 50's, who rent their home from her septuagenarian parents, the [REDACTED], who live in Mariposa County. The address of their next-door property is [REDACTED] Villa Drive; it is immediately south of my property. They raised the now 25-year-old son, [REDACTED] there. He is a young man who has always had more than his share of woes. Recently though, he went out on his own as a painter, so in a narrow sense, he is doing better. He now lives elsewhere, but keeps some of his vehicles at the [REDACTED] Villa Drive property.

Beginning in 2016, I took in a man I knew and liked, who owns a ranch property east of Snelling. He was being treated for a late-stage cancer, and needed care. I became his care-giver; the County of Merced oversees our business relationship. After two years, he has begun to regain his health, and, one at a time, he brought some of his 10 pieces of rolling stock, mainly older pickups, here, to do light repair work on them. He did this both for the attention those vehicles needed, and for his own rehabilitation. In so doing, it was required that he come and go from the pad much more often than did my deceased husband and I. It alarmed the [REDACTED] who had and have a habit of parking their five (5) vehicles and old boat on a trailer, wherever they want,

and whenever they want, including in front of my home. They never use their two-car garage for parking any of their vehicles or trailer. They often block ingress and egress to my parking/drive pad. Try as we might to appease them, they became hostile because we wanted and needed free access to and from our parking/drive pad. We tried to keep the situation in check, but it has boiled over. Their negative attitude was first shown by [REDACTED] taking a skill saw, and actually cutting down the white picket fence I had installed between our properties, before the man I care for, came to live here. [REDACTED] then "egged" the man's car, when it was parked on the pad. And most recently, "someone" smashed out his driver's side window when it was parked off to the side of my garage, which is on the north side of my property, and which I use to shelter and protect my car. (It recently cost the man \$265 to have the window, and damage that was done to the window motor, replaced and repaired; before it could have it done though, recent rains, damaged his car driver's seat.) Because the [REDACTED] didn't help us solve the issue, we contacted the [REDACTED]. They notified the [REDACTED]. Some progress was made, the most being, they moved [REDACTED] away; however, [REDACTED] mother and he became enraged! As a result, we have had two incidents here, which is the very last thing we want. We reported all three incidents to the Merced Police. I had a camera system installed to help fend off future possible issues.

Presently, if we need to park at the curb in front of our home, there is often no room for us to do that. Additionally, we are absolutely proscribed from using our parking/driving pad, as the [REDACTED] are spitefully and continually parking their old motor home or old boat on their boat trailer at the curb in front of it, sometimes moving them only inches, and sometimes reversing the positions of the unsightly vehicle/boat & trailer, just before the expiration of each 72 hour period, to comply with existing law.

We need open ingress and egress to my parking/drive pad. The cost of a new curb cut would be prohibitively expensive for me; therefore, we appealed to the city attorney, who was very helpful. At her direction, yesterday, we submitted a request that the City of Merced paint the curb in front of my parking/drive pad, red. Then, when we came in yesterday, City Surveyor Cardoso suggested that instead of asking the City to paint the curb in front of our parking pad "red," request that the City paint it "blue," depicting parking for handicapped only. Both the man who lives here, [REDACTED], who is 81 years of age, and I, a few years younger, have permanent Disabled placards from the California Department of Motor Vehicles.

Being that your meeting in which you will discuss and hopefully decide upon my request, will be January 14, 2020, and being I have a vacation to my native Hawaii scheduled to start that day, I have asked the man I care for, [REDACTED], to attend the meeting in my stead. He said he would. He may speak on my behalf. I believe he will be able to answer any questions you may have. Thank you.
